Is it Garbage Or Recycling?



Pizza Box: Dirty boxes are garbage, and clean boxes can be placed in your yellow bins.

Plastic Grocery Bags: Bags are recyclable provided they are placed into one bag and they are clean.

Styrofoam: All styrofoam is garbage, which includes white, pink, black and packing peanuts, plates and cups.

Aerosol Cans and Frozen Juice cans (paper container with tin top): Aerosol cans and juice cans are garbage.

Metal Appliances: Appliances are recyclable as long as it is at least 75% metal. Be sure to cut the cord and/or remove the batteries.

Volunteers Needed

CHALK RIVER WATER SYSTEM USERS

In order to comply with provincial regulations and as part of the on-going efforts to ensure the safety of drinking water, the municipality must test the drinking water supply for the presence of lead.

The Town of Laurentian Hills is looking for 1 Business and 10 Residential Home Owners who are connected to the Chalk River Water System to participate in the testing and permit staff from the Water Treatment Plant to take water samples for lead testing.

The testing will be performed twice a year and each test will take approximately 45 minutes. Testing periods are once between June 15 to October 15, 2016 and once between December 15, 2016 to April 15 2017.

Volunteers will be given ample notice prior to any testing and will be provided of copies of the test results.

No owner or person in charge of any animal shall allow the animal to defecate anywhere on property unless the owner ensures that the excreta are removed and disposed of in a sanitary manner. By-law No. 14-05 failure to comply is subject to a penalty. A reminder to **NOT** let your dogs or cats on beaches or playgrounds and be sure to **NOT** let them roam freely. *Be sure your pet is on a leash at all times.*

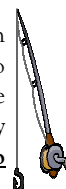

Watering Restrictions

For users of the Chalk River water system. Even numbered houses may only water on even numbered days and odd numbered houses may only water on odd numbered watering days. The watering hours are between 6:00 am and 8:00 am. and between 6:00 pm and 9:00 pm. It is illegal to connect your sump pump to the sewer system. (By-Law 19-10)

Volunteer Driver's Needed

In 2015 Volunteer drivers transported 151 clients from North Renfrew a total of 88421 kms to medical and other appointments in town and long distance to Pembroke, Ottawa and points in between. Volunteers drive clients in their own vehicle or in one of the Centre's wheelchair accessible vans. North Renfrew Long-Term Care Services currently requires more volunteer drivers. Drivers must have a clear Driver's Abstract and a clear Criminal Record and Vulnerable Sector Check. Volunteers using their own vehicles are reimbursed per kilometre for long distance drives.

From the Fire Chief

As of April 15, 2015 it is mandatory for all residences with solid fuel burning appliances OR an attached garage to have working CO alarms as well as working smoke alarms on every level of their dwellings. If you do not have one of these devices present or in working order they will be issuing a \$235 fine for each faulty /or missing device.
