EASTER GARBAGE CHANGES

Regular Garbage pick-up on Friday March 30, 2018 will be **rescheduled** to **Thursday March 29, 2018**.

Regular Tuesday garbage pickup will **NOT** change.

Garbage Collection Guidelines



- 2 bag limit per week for garbage - Bag tag required on the third or more bags - Maximum volume of 154 litres of household waste (without a tag) - All bags brought to Baggs Road Landfill will require payment of \$2.00 per bag. Wrap bag tag around neck of bag and stick ends together. - Tags can be purchased at the Town office or at Baggs Road - Copying or reproducing bag tags is illegal. For collection concerns contact the Town office :613-584-3114.

Fibre Recycling Yellow Box

-Newspaper, magazines, catalogues, flyers, junk mail -boxboard paperboard: cereal and cracker boxes, (no wax bag inside) egg cartons (no egg shells) toilet paper/paper towel rolls - Office paper (typing/computer paper -Cardboard (corrugated) must be broken down 2' x 2' brown "craft" paper bags, paper pet food bags (coated liner is ok) -soft cover books, hard cover books (spine and cover removed) -shredded paper in clear bags.

Commingled Blue Box

Tin cans (place lid inside and pinch can closed, empty paint cans, no plastic with metal tops and or bottoms or handles) -Aluminum cans, pie plates, trays, foil wrap (no foil with paper or plastic laminate) -clear + coloured glass food and beverage bottles (cleaned) -Plastic food and beverage containers #1 PET bottles, #2–#7 bottles, tubs and lids -Milk and juice cartons, ice cream (clean) -Grocery bags, (outer wrap from water, toilet paper, paper towels (place all these in one bag, bag of bags)

Planning on Building? When is a Permit Required

Any new building over 108 ft² (9 x 12) including garages, decks, and porches. If a building is less than 108 ft² (9 x 12) it must still meet the zoning and all setback requirements for the property. Any addition to an existing building including porches or decks. Any extensive renovations that would include structural alterations. Demolition of any building. All sewage systems. Partitioning and finishing a basement. Damp proofing or waterproofing foundation walls, including installation of drainage tile.

Water Samples Drop off

Water Sample Bottles are available at the municipal office in Point Alexander. Samples to be taken the same day as they are dropped off. **April to August**—>Drop off Monday to Thursdays. **September to March** —> Drop off **Tuesday and Wednesday only**.

A Word from the Fire Chief and Firefighters

It is mandatory for all residences with solid fuel burning appliances OR an attached garage to have working CO alarms as well as working smoke alarms on every level of their dwellings. If you do not have one of these devices present or in working order they will be issuing a \$235 fine for each faulty /or missing device.

Pick Up After Pets

Always pick up after your pet. A reminder that dogs/cats are not allowed on beaches or playgrounds and be sure to **not** let them roam freely. Be sure your pet is on a leash **at all times**. Animal waste attracts rats, transmits disease and contains bacteria that can contaminate water which contribute to swim advisories and increased health risks for people using the beach.

Biking vs. Walking

When walking on town roads with no sidewalks, please walk on the left facing traffic. When biking, always bike with traffic on the right in single file.

New Textile Recycling Bin and Re-Use Area
