

# **NEW SHORT-TERM RECYCLING COLLECTION**

Effective July 17th the Town's Recycling pickup will alternate between containers one week (plastic and glass) and fibres the other week (carboard and paper) Pick ups will now be done weekly on Wednesdays and Thursdays as outlined below.

Residents who have their garbage picked up on **Tuesday** will have their <u>recycling picked up on Wednesday</u>.

Residents who have their garbage picked up on **Friday** will have their <u>recycling picked up on Thursday</u>.

Dual stream pick-up is tentatively scheduled to resume in September (more details to come).

## BLUE BOX - Commingled Recycling Box

Tin cans ( place lid inside and pinch can so lid stays in )
 Open and empty metal paint cans (no plastic paint cans with metal tops and/or bottoms)
 Aluminum cans, pie plates, trays
 Clear and coloured glass food and beverage bottles and jars scraped and empty and rinsed clean
 Plastic food and beverage containers, #1 water bottles, #2 - #7 bottles, tubs and lids
 Milk and juice cartons, drinking boxes
 Ice cream containers rinsed and cleaned

# YELLOW BOX - Fibre Recycling Box

- Household newspaper, magazines, catalogues, flyers and junk mail
- Boxboard/paperboard: cereal boxes (no wax bags inside), cracker boxes, tissue boxes, "paper" egg cartons (no eggshells), toilet paper/paper towel rolls Office paper, eg. writing, typing and computer paper Cardboard, corrugated brown paper bags Soft cover books, hard cover books with spine and cover removed only Coffee/pop trays
  - Shredded paper must be in a clear plastic bag Cardboard to be broken into 2' x 2' bundles and tied.





### **GARBAGE (Not Accepted in Either Recycling Bins)**

- Film plastics such as grocery bags, outer wrap from cases of water, toilet paper and paper towel (bag of bags)
- Fast food coffee/pop cups and lids Cat/Dog paper food bags Black plastic trays, mushroom/meat trays)
- Bubble wrap Sandwich bags and Bread bags Produce / bulk food bags and dry cleaning bag
- All styrofoam products (plates, cups, meat trays, packing peanuts, foam egg cartons, packaging
- Wax boxboard (eg. Banana boxes) Blister plastic packaging Bubble wrap Binders Toys Cereal bags
- Candy bar wrappers Ceramics Window pane glass (including tempered glass) Beverage 6 pack rings
- CD DVD's and cases VHS tapes and cases Cracker and Cookie bags and cookie box liners Milk bags
- Chip bags Shoes Tupperware Rubbermaid Plastic strapping Christmas tree lights Clothesline
- Cork Dialysis tubing Hard cover books Plastic or Metal strapping Picture frames Dishes
- Plastic or Plastic coated metal hangers
   Fiber glass feed bags
   Light bulbs (incandescent)
   Straws
- Remote controls "Real" Zippered plastic bags (usually for blankets or bed-in-a-bag sets) Sponge foam
- Foam sheeting
   Car parts
   Photographs
   Planting trays/pots
   Pots and pans
   Boat wrap
- Agricultural wrap
   Soiled or biodegradable plastic bags
   Pool noodles
   Rope
   Garden hoses
- Solar blankets Diapers Plastic paint cans and cans with paint Oil containers Aluminum foil wrap

These items WILL contaminate your yellow/blue bins. Please dispose of them in your regular garbage.

\*Aerosol Cans must be brought to Baggs Road to the HHW area.

BAGGS ROAD LANDFILL (WEEE products and HHW items are free for drop-off)

Summer Hours of Operation: Tuesday 9:00 am – 6:00 pm Wednesday to Saturday 9:00 am – 4:00 pm Winter Hours of Operation: Tuesday to Saturday 9:00 am - 4:00 pm

Please note that permits can be purchased at the Municipal Office or at the Baggs Road Landfill.

Regular garbage (\$ 2 per bag tag) Mattresses and upholstered furniture (\$10 per), and NiCd batteries. Carpeting that is dry, free of contamination, cut into 4 feet and tightly rolled (including underlay). (No Cost) All sizes of car and Truck Tires on or off rims. Metal waste such as; plumbing pipes, metal ceilings, siding, or roofing, reinforcing rods, metal studs, I-beams, stoves, refrigerators and other such appliances, angle iron and heating ductwork and other metal materials are also accepted at Baggs Rd. Brush is also accepted.

**HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE** is accepted (No Cost) at the landfill which includes: fluorescent tubes, automobile, truck, motorcycle or tractor lead/acid batteries, paint in cans, propane tanks (empty) used motor oil, aerosol cans, appliances containing refrigerant (freezers, refrigeration and dehumidifiers) engine antifreeze (ie glycol) fertilizers, pesticides, gasoline, diesel fuel, kerosene, varsol, aerosol, methanol or other flammable liquids.

#### MILLER ROAD LANDFILL CONSTRUCTION AND DEMOLITION WASTE

Hours of Operation Tuesday to Saturday 9:00 am to 12 pm. Construction and demolition waste is defined as all non-hazardous low metal content waste from construction and demolition clean up projects, consisting primarily of; wood, blocks/stone/bricks, non-metal roofing material, insulation, waste furniture (which does not include mattresses and box springs), window glass, sinks, toilets, non metal siding material, concrete and small amounts of plastic and fiberglass. Permits can be obtained from the Deep River Town Office during their regular business hours <u>or</u> by cash at the landfill. For more information call the Town of Deep River at 613-584-2000.

Please take note that alcohol bottles and cans must be returned to the LCBO.

Needle disposal must be brought back to pharmacies.
