- 2. That all work must be done in accordance to and be in compliance with Ontario Regulation 170 Safe Drinking Water Act and the American Water Works Association codes
- 3. That in accordance with the Ministry of the Environment for Climate change the Standard for Disinfecting Water Mains be followed for the extension of the line
- 4. That all persons installing the water lines are qualified and licensed to do so
- 5. That Form 1 A record of Water mains Authorized as a Future Alteration be filled out and signed by a Professional Engineer qualified to do so as outlined on the form and returned to the Town with the build drawings attached
- 6. That the Town be contacted for a meeting prior to the work being done and the work be coordinated with the Town's Plant Operators

- 2. that the Public Works Superintendent be advised of the start date and schedule of activities and any issues that may arise during the performance of the work
- 3. that TCP inform all the private property owners within the proposed work area of the work and estimated time lines and obtain any permissions from the property owners for any work that may affect their property
- 4. that any brushing and excavated rock/boulders be removed from the site and disposed of by TCP to the satisfaction of the Public Works Superintendent
- 5. TCP shall indemnify and save harmless the Municipality from:
  - any loss, inconvenience, damage or cost to the Municipality which may result from TCP or any of its employees, contractors, subcontractors and their employees failing to act safely or to comply with any Acts in the performance of any work or service required
  - b) any action or claim, or costs related thereto, brought against the Municipality by any person arising out of any unsafe act or practice or any non-compliance with any Act by TPC or any of its employees, contractors, subcontractors and their employees in the performance of any work or service connected to the installation of the cathodic protection system
