| 13 | 14 | The Ontario Blue Box Regulation under the Resource Recovery and Circular Economy Act, 2016 designates Blue Box materials, including packaging-like and paper products, under Ontario's new regulatory framework for resource recovery. The regulation makes producers fully accountable and financially responsible for their products and packaging once they reach their end of life and are | | | | |

requirements for Blue Box collection systems; and gives producers choices for resource recovery services in a competitive market. Effective July 1, 2023, municipalities and First Nation communities started transitioning their Blue Box programs to the new framework and Blue Box producers became fully accountable and financially responsible for collecting and recycling their material when consumers discard them. The Town of Laurentian Hills will transition to the new program on July 15, 2025, and will no longer be responsible for providing a recycling program. Recycling pick ups will continue under the new program. The information that we have been provided with is that the current recycling pick-up days should remain the same until December 31, 2025, after which they are subject to change. At this point in time, we are unaware of who will be the Contractor for the pick-up service after July 15, 2025.

All clean material must be set out for collection by **7:00 a.m.**
Materials must be set out in a clearly recognizable box container at the curb.

YELLOW BOX - Fibre Recycling Box

- Household newspaper, magazines, catalogues, flyers and junk mail
- Boxboard/paperboard: cereal boxes (no wax bags inside), cracker boxes, tissue boxes, "paper" egg cartons (no eggshells), toilet paper/paper towel rolls
- Office paper, eg. writing, typing and computer paper (coloured and white)
- Cardboard, corrugated brown paper bags
- Soft cover books, Coffee/pop trays
- Shredded paper must be in a clear plastic bag
- Cardboard to be broken into 2' x 2' bundles and tied.

BLUE BOX - Commingled Recycling Box

- Tin cans (place lid inside and pinch can so lid stays in)
- Open and empty metal paint cans (no plastic paint cans with metal tops and / or bottoms)
- Aluminum cans, pie plates, trays
- Clear and coloured glass food and beverage bottles and jars scraped and empty and rinsed clean
- Plastic food and beverage containers, #1 water bottles, #2 - #7 bottles, tubs and lids
- Milk and juice cartons, drinking boxes
- Ice cream containers rinsed and cleaned
- cardboard cans.

GARBAGE (Not Accepted in Either Recycling Bins)

- Film plastics such as grocery bags, outer wrap from cases of water, toilet paper and paper towel and bag of bags
- All fast food coffee/pop cups and lids
- Cat/Dog paper food bags
- Black plastic trays, mushroom/meat trays
- Bubble wrap
- Sandwich bags and Bread bags
- Produce / Bulk food bags and Dry cleaning bags
- All styrofoam products plates, cups, meat trays, packing peanuts, foam egg cartons, packaging
- Pizza boxes
- Wax boxboard (eg. Banana boxes)
- Blister plastic packaging

- Toys

- Window pane glass (including tempered glass)

These items WILL contaminate your yellow/blue bins. Please dispose of them in your regular garbage.

**Aerosol cans must be brought to Baggs Road to the HHW area.*

Please take note that alcohol bottles and cans must be returned to the LCBO.

Needle disposal must be brought back to pharmacies.

BAGGS ROAD LANDFILL (WEEE products and HHW items are free to drop-off)

Summer Hours of Operation: Tuesday 9:00 am – 6:00 pm Wednesday to Saturday 9:00 am – 4:00 pm

Winter Hours of Operation: Tuesday to Saturday 9:00 am - 4:00 pm

Please note that permits can be purchased at the Municipal Office or at the Baggs Road Landfill (cash only).

Regular garbage (\$ 2 per bag tag) Mattresses and upholstered furniture (\$10 per), and NiCd batteries.

Carpeting that is dry, free of contamination, cut into 4 feet and tightly rolled (including underlay). (No Cost)

All sizes of car and Truck Tires on or off rims. Metal waste such as; plumbing pipes, metal ceilings, siding, roofing, reinforcing rods, metal studs, I-beams, stoves, refrigerators and other such appliances, angle iron and heating ductwork and other metal materials are also accepted at Baggs Rd. Brush is also accepted.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE is accepted (No Cost) at the landfill which includes: fluorescent tubes, automobile, truck, motorcycle or tractor lead/acid batteries, railway ties, paint in cans, propane tanks (empty) used motor oil, aerosol cans, appliances containing refrigerant (freezers, refrigeration and dehumidifiers) engine antifreeze (ie glycol) fertilizers, pesticides, gasoline, diesel fuel, kerosene, varsol, aerosol, methanol or other flammable liquids.

MILLER ROAD LANDFILL CONSTRUCTION AND DEMOLITION WASTE

Hours of Operation: Tuesday to Saturday 9:00 am to 12 pm. Construction and demolition waste is defined as all non-hazardous low metal content waste from construction and demolition clean up projects, consisting primarily of wood, blocks/stone/bricks, non-metal roofing material, insulation, railway ties, waste furniture (does not include mattresses and box springs), fibreglass boats, hot tubs, window glass, sinks, toilets, non metal siding material, concrete, plastic and fiberglass. Permits can be obtained from the Deep River Town Office during their regular business hours **or** by cash at the landfill. For more information call the Town of Deep River at 613-584-2000.
