## 2026 Municipal Election

Municipal Elections will take place **Monday 26 October, 2026**. Residents of the Town of Laurentian Hills will elect One (1) Mayor, Four (4) Ward Councillors (one for each of the 4 Wards) and School Board Trustees. The Town of Laurentian Hills will be using the traditional paper ballot at the Advance Vote and on Voting day.

Anyone interested in running in the 2026 election may file their nomination papers with the Town Clerk by appointment only during regular office hours. Nominations may be filed until **2:00 p.m.—August 21st 2026**. If you have any questions about running for Council, please contact our office at 613-584-3114. ## How To Dispose Of Batteries

Terminal protection **is required** on rechargeable batteries (Lithium Ion and all small sealed lead acid. (SSLA/Pb) Primary batteries; all lithium, button coin cell and alkaline (over 12v). Tape the terminal with clear packing tape, duct tape or electrical tape. Do Not Use painter's tape, masking tape or scotch tape. Tape the positive end (raised or exposed side of the battery). If it looks, smells or sounds "off" - segregate it immediately! Batteries that don't require terminal protection are Nickel Cadmium (Ni-Cd) Nickel Metal Hydride (Ni-MH) and Nickel Zinc (Ni-Zn) Primary batteries Alkaline (under 12v) Carbon Zinc.

**REMINDER:** Batteries can be dropped off at the Chalk River library or at the municipal office during open hours. **Not sure if the battery requires terminal protection? BAG IT!**

## Planning on Building? Permit Required?

Constructing a **new building** larger than 10 m<sup>2</sup> (approximately 108 ft<sup>2</sup>) (exceptions apply for small garden sheds up to 15 m<sup>2</sup>) This includes any addition to an existing building including porches, pole sheds or decks as well as any extensive renovations that would include structural alterations, demolition of any building, all sewage systems, partitioning and finishing a basement, damp proofing or waterproofing foundation walls, including installation of drainage tile. If a building is less than 108ft<sup>2</sup> (10 m<sup>2</sup>) it must still meet the zoning and all setback requirements for the property. If you are unsure whether your project needs a permit, it's always best to contact the Town's Building & Planning Department before beginning work.
