

RCD COVID-19 Vaccine Rollout at a Glance

Update: March 24, 2021



Key Messages

1. Eligible people who can currently register for a vaccination appointment can visit www.rcdhu.com or ontario.ca/bookvaccine. If you can't access the online system, ask a family member or friend to assist you.

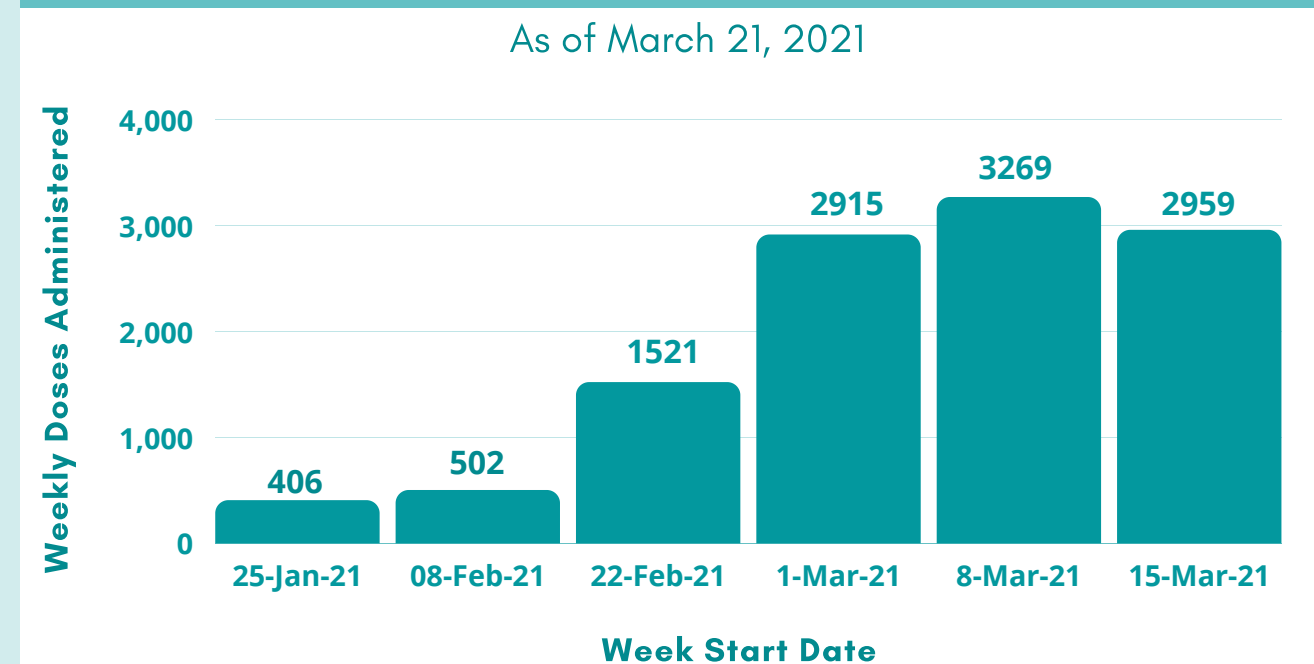
2. If you can't register online, please call RCDHU at 613-735-9724 or 1-800-267-1097 extension 200. The phone lines will be answered 7 days/week, from 8:00 am - 4:00 pm. **Please leave your name and number, and only leave one voice message.**

3. The Ontario Government is following the National Advisory Committee on Immunization recommendation to delay the second dose. As such, all vaccinations currently taking place are for those receiving their first dose only. All second doses, except for a minority of classifications, will be administered 16 weeks after the first.

Eligible people who can register & book appointments



Phase 1:

- > Adults 80+ (born in 1941 or earlier)
- > Indigenous adults 18+
- > All healthcare workers
- > All seniors in congregate care residences
- > Long-term care and retirement home essential caregivers
- > Anyone receiving chronic home care that have been identified by home health care organizations*

*This group will receive a call notifying them that they are eligible to register.

Eligible people who can register but are currently unable to book an appointment

- Adults 75-79 (born between 1942-1946)
- Faith based leaders who, as part of their role, provide end of life care, care of the deceased, home visits to unwell persons, or pastoral care in LTC/RHs or other vulnerable settings

i Note: Vaccine appointment availability will be based on the number of doses that RCD receives each week. People should anticipate that it will take a number of weeks to complete the eligible groups.
