Walks in the Woods: This Wednesday, Oct. 29, meet at 1:30 pm at the parking space on Balmer's Bay Road about 1 km past the chalet, just before Kennedy Creek. We will do the Boulder Stroll, starting near the Hollo Bridge and going first to the Voyageur Boulder near the river edge, then back to the section leading to the Metcalfe Boulder on the other side of Balmer's Bay Road. You can compare the size of these two erratics left by retreating glaciers. Caution: these trails are rough as they are more recently laid out so are not well-worn yet. If we get enough people walking, this will help to beat them down! Wear sturdy boots and use walking poles. Total distance is about 4 km but you could omit part for a shorter distance.

Painting with Elaine:

Beginner Watercolours – December 2 and 9:

This 2-week class in the Deep River Library 10:00 am - noon will go over the very basics of watercolour painting. It is for the complete novice or those who would like a refresher class. Professional grade paper, paint and brushes will be provided. Students must bring a white plate or palette with them so that Elaine can provide dabs of paint.
